

## **LTA SUMMER COUNTY CUP - '15 – 15 CLUB' EXPLAINED**

### ***What is the '15 – 15 Club'?***

This 'initiative' was set-up in 2015 to help raise awareness of the Summer County Cup Event by recognising those players achieving 15 rubbers out of 15 during the course of 'County Week'. This covers all divisions in both the men's and women's groups.

### ***What if I have won 15 – 15 wins but it is not showing on the Roll of Honour?***

County Week data went computerised in 2010 and, unfortunately, there are no definitive records across all divisions of anyone accomplishing the 15 out of 15 milestone prior to this date. ### ***Who holds the record for the most consecutive 15 – 15 wins?***

The Roll of Honour is still very much in its infancy and any player, who has achieved 15-15, should e-mail [countycup@lta.org.uk](mailto:countycup@lta.org.uk) with the relevant details.

### ***What happens if I win 15 – 15 rubbers?***

It is felt this is a remarkable accomplishment and currently, any player achieving this feat, will be added to the Roll of Honour and will receive a trophy following the Event. In addition, they will receive a pair of show court tickets to the following year's Wimbledon Championships and an invitation to The LTA Cocktail Party.

### ***Do I have to play with the same partner for the whole week?***

No. You could play with different partners

### ***What happens if it rains on the last day and I am unable to play the last rubber?***

Wherever possible, in fairness to the player(s) hoping to achieve 15 – 15, a minimum of one game should be played. The previous 2 rubbers should have been played in full and in a manner so as not to bring the game into disrepute!

### ***What if the opposing pair in the final rubber on any day refuse or are unable to play?***

It is hoped this would not happen and the Referee(s) of the Group(s) concerned will be asked by the Event Director, weather permitting, to 'strongly encourage' the relevant Team Captain and team to play the rubber. If it is felt a minimum of one game could be played and a county refuses to play, they will not receive any 'round' points for the County Cup Race leaderboard.

### ***How much of a rubber needs to be played for it to count as a rubber win?***

As described above, a minimum of one game should be played in each rubber. All 4 players must be on court and playing in a manner so as not to bring the game into disrepute!
